This does not compete with the cost of advertising in our State magazine, the Bugle, but the Review is often read by travelling square dancers who just might be heading in the direction of your Club and who just might decide to attend your special dance.

I also recognise that your advert has to be forwarded to me long before the date of the dance, but most Clubs plan the dates of their special dances very early in the year, in which case, they can contact myself or whoever the Qld Editor may be as soon as the dates are set, and in one phone call, arrange for the ads to be included in the appropriate monthly editions. This system has been successfully followed by Suncoasters for a number of years now.

Why not report on the success of your Club's special dance or on anything that would be of interest to other dancers not only in Qld, but nationally? There is no charge for these types of articles.

At the recent Qld Society meeting, it was decided that "Club News" of no more than 60 words will be subsidised by the Society. If you would like to submit your Club's news, please remember that no actual dates of future dance events can be used. If a date is given, the article is classed as advertising and a cost will be incurred. The Society will not subsidise advertising.

My aim is to boost the popularity of the Review if at all possible, but as an editor, I can only publish information or articles that are contributed.
